

A Gentle Reminder About Using ClassDojo

We kindly ask parents and carers to use ClassDojo with consideration. Over recent weeks, teachers have noticed an increase in the number of messages being sent throughout the day. While we absolutely value open communication and want to stay connected, we also need to ensure that staff can focus on teaching and supporting children without feeling overwhelmed.

Please remember:

- Teachers are with children most of the day and cannot respond instantly;
- Dojo should be used for essential messages only, rather than ongoing conversations;
- For urgent matters, contacting the school office is always the best route.

Being mindful in your use of messaging helps protect staff wellbeing and ensures workloads remain manageable. Thank you for your continued support.
